Communion Meditation & Closing Prayer: James Williams

Monday: In John 15:12-13 Jesus said that real love lays itself down. Love ain't always loud...sometimes it looks like giving up comfort, convenience, pride, or time so somebody else can see Jesus clearer. Salt costs something when it's poured out. Light burns something to shine. Becoming mission minded means asking, "What can I sacrifice so someone else might be lifted?" Sometimes the greatest sermons aren't preached, they're lived through surrendered hearts. Lord, teach us to love so deeply that we willingly give up what we want to lift others toward You. May we find strength in sacrifice. In Jesus name, amen.

Tuesday: Luke 9:23 reminds us Jesus didn't say "follow Me when it's easy." He said deny yourself daily. Whew! Daily means this ain't a one-time sacrifice. Sometimes following Jesus means giving up status, habits, popularity, or personal plans. Why? Because crosses aren't comfortable, but they're transformational. We give up pieces of ourselves so Christ can be seen more clearly through us. Missions minded folks understand sacrifice isn't losing...it's investing eternally. What are you carrying that needs surrendering today? Lord, help us deny ourselves boldly so others may see You. In Jesus name... amen.

Wednesday: Romans 12:1 calls us living sacrifices. That means we don't just die for Christ someday...we live for Him today. Sacrifice isn't always dramatic. Sometimes it's serving when tired, forgiving when hurt, giving when it pinches, showing kindness when it's hard. Living sacrifice means placing our whole selves on God's altar daily. Why? Because surrendered lives shine brightly. Let others be drawn to Jesus by seeing what you're willing to give up. God, make our daily surrender a beacon that points others straight to You. In Jesus, amen.

Thursday: Luke 19 shows Zacchaeus giving up wealth and selfishness after meeting Jesus. Nobody forced him. Love changed him. When Jesus truly grabs your heart, sacrifice stops feeling like punishment and starts becoming worship. Zacchaeus lifted others by giving up what once controlled him. Sometimes our mission means releasing what we cling to so someone else can experience God's goodness. What are you holding too tightly? Position? Money? Comfort? Tradition? Let Jesus reshape it. Father, loosen our grip on temporary things so we can lift others toward eternal truth. In Jesus, amen.

Friday: Salt works when it leaves the shaker. Light shines when it enters the dark. Missions minded living means moving beyond comfort zones for Kingdom purposes. Sacrifice may mean giving your time, resources, reputation, or preferences so others can meet Jesus. It may be costly... but souls matter more. Jesus gave everything, not so we'd live comfortably, but purposefully. Sometimes we give up what feels safe to lift up what matters most. Lord, help us step out boldly, sacrificing gladly for the mission. In Jesus name, amen.

Saturday: Strength in sacrifice isn't weakness, it's Christlikeness. Jesus gave up heaven's glory, carried the cross, and sacrificed everything to lift us from sin to salvation. Now we follow Him. Becoming missions minded means understanding our sacrifices, big or small, can become bridges that lead others to Jesus. Don't fear sacrifice... fear wasted opportunities. Today, ask yourself: "What can I give up so Christ may be lifted up?" Father, make us courageous in sacrifice and faithful in mission. Help us be the good. In Jesus name... amen.
