KCC Daily Devotion

Monday: Take a look at Colossians 3:12–14 today. We spend time deciding what to wear because we know people will see us. Paul says followers of Jesus should be intentional about what we wear **spiritually** too. Compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, forgiveness, and love should be visible wherever we go. Before leaving your house, check more than the mirror...check your heart. What are you wearing? Father, dress my heart in the character of Jesus on the daily so others can see You through me. In Jesus' name, amen.

Tuesday: Compassion means we don't simply notice someone hurting...we care enough to respond. Jesus never treated struggling folks as inconvenient. He saw, loved, and moved toward them. In Colossians 3:12, Paul tells us to "put on" compassion. Somebody around you may be carrying something incredibly heavy mentally/emotionally. You don't have to fix everything.

Sometimes simply caring helps carry the load. God, open my eyes to hurt folks. Give me a heart that notices, cares, and responds like Jesus. In Him, amen.

Wednesday: Kindness never goes out of style. A gentle word, an unexpected compliment, helping someone who's struggling, simply treating people with dignity can completely change the day. Kindness doesn't require money, talent, or title...it just requires us to care. Of all the things you could wear today, kindness looks pretty dang good on everybody. Check out Colossians 3:12 and wear it well. Father, make kindness obvious in my words and actions today. Help me treat everyone as someone deeply loved by You. In Jesus, amen.

Thursday: Colossians 3:12–13 reminds us to put on patience and bear with one another. Patience sounds great until somebody gives us an opportunity to practice it! People are difficult. Truth is...we can be too. Following Jesus means giving others some of the grace we desperately want given to us. Be patient today. They may be fighting a battle you know nothing about. Lord, slow down my reactions today. Give me patience, gentleness, and grace with difficult people and situations. Help me respond like Jesus. In His name, amen.

Friday: Forgiveness doesn't mean pretending something didn't hurt or saying wrong somehow became right. It means refusing to let bitterness become something we wear everywhere we go. Paul reminds us why we forgive: "just as the Lord has forgiven you." Take some time with Colossians 3:13 today and remember just how much grace Jesus has given you. Forgiven people should be forgiving people. Jesus, thank You for forgiving me. Help me release bitterness, extend grace, and forgive as You have forgiven me. In Jesus, amen.

Saturday: After compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, and forgiveness, Paul says, "Above all, put on love (Col. 3:14)." Love pulls the whole outfit together. Without love, kindness can become an act and patience can become obligation. But when everything flows from true love for God and people, others get a glimpse of Jesus through us. Get well dressed before you ever reach your closet. Father, above everything else, help me put on love and let everything I do flow from loving You and others. In Jesus' name, amen.
