KCC Daily Devotion

Monday: Read Mark 14:43–45. Judas didn't come swinging a sword...he came with a kiss. The sign of love became the mark of betrayal. Jesus knew it was coming and still stood there. No running. No fighting. Just surrender to the Father's plan. Sometimes the deepest wounds come from the closest people. And yet, Jesus didn't let betrayal change His mission. He stayed faithful. Lord, when I feel hurt or betrayed, help me stay faithful to You...not bitter toward others. Help me truly stay focused on being the good. In Jesus name, amen.

Tuesday: Check out Mark 14:50. "Then they all deserted Him and ran away." That line hits hard. The ones who said, "I'll never leave You"...left. In His darkest moment, Jesus stood alone. He knows what abandonment feels like. When you feel like nobody understands...He does. And He still kept going. He didn't quit when people failed Him. Jesus, when I feel alone, remind me You never leave me...give me strength to keep going, in Jesus' name, amen.

Wednesday: Look at Mark 14:60–61. False witnesses, twisted words, loud accusations...and Jesus stayed silent. He didn't defend Himself. He didn't argue His case. Why not? Because truth doesn't need to panic. Jesus trusted the Father even when lies filled the room. We're quick to defend ourselves, ain't we? We're quick to clap back, to prove we're right. But sometimes strength looks like silence. Father, teach me when to speak and when to be still. Help me trust You to defend me. Help my integrity shine. In Jesus name, amen.

Thursday: Peter swore he'd never fall, and then in Mark 14:66–72 we see he denied Jesus three times. Fear will make you say things you never thought you would. The rooster crowed, and Peter broke down. Failure hurts...especially when you love Jesus. But this isn't the end of Peter's story...and it's not the end of yours either. Grace is coming. Good God Almighty, when I fail You, remind me Your grace is greater than my mistakes. Restore me in Jesus, amen.

Friday: Check out Mark 15:1–20. In verse 15, Pilate knew Jesus was innocent...and still handed Him over. Pressure from the crowd and fear of people won the day. And Jesus said nothing. He willingly stepped into the path of the cross. Not forced, but chosen. This wasn't an accident...this was love in action. Lord, help me choose You over the crowd. Help me remember that Your sacrifice was for me. Help me strive to reach just 1 more in Jesus' name, amen.

Saturday: Re-read Mark 15:1-20 again. Picture how they dressed Him up, mocked Him, struck Him, spit on Him, and made joke a our Savior. The King of Kings treated like a criminal. And He took it. Not because He was weak...but because He was strong enough to endure it for us. Every blow, every insult He carried for you and me. Holy Savior, I thank You for enduring what I deserved. Help me never take Your sacrifice lightly. I'm all Yours. In Jesus name, amen.
