Communion Meditation & Closing Prayer: Cohen Shortridge

Monday: This week we're in Colossians 3. Each day will start with showing which section to read. Today, check out vs. 1-2. Everything down here fights for our attention—problems, bills, drama, worry, frustration. Yet Paul tells us to “seek what is above.” We live, work, love, and serve here...but this ain't home. Don't become so consumed with what's happening around you that you forget what's waiting ahead. Keep your eyes on glory. Father, lift my eyes above today's distractions and keep my heart focused on You and where I truly belong. I may like it here at times...but this ain't home. In Jesus' name, amen.

Tuesday: For today, read Colossians 3:3-4. Your identity isn't found in your job, possessions, mistakes, popularity, or somebody's opinion. Paul says your life is “hidden with Christ in God.” You belong to Jesus! Today may be difficult, but today ain't the ending. We know where this story is headed and Who holds tomorrow. Keep your eyes on glory. Every problem resolves eventually. God, remind me that my identity and future are secure in Jesus. Help me live confidently because I belong completely to You. In Jesus' name, amen.

Wednesday: Check out verses 5-7. Paul doesn't tell us to manage our sinful desires. He says, “put to death” what belongs to our earthly nature. In other words...kill what's killing you (just not people, ok? We don't want to see you in the news for bad reasons.). Some habits don't need moderation; they need elimination. Some temptations don't need negotiation; they need surrender. You've been given new life...quit feeding the old one. Jesus, show me what needs to die within me and give me strength to surrender anything keeping me from becoming more like You. I need You. In Your holy name I pray, amen.

Thursday: Verses 8-9 today. Anger. Wrath. Malice. Slander. Filthy language. Lying. Paul basically says, “Take that stuff off!” You shouldn't shower and put dirty clothes back on...yet sometimes we receive new life in Jesus while continuing to wear old attitudes. Jesus changes how we speak, react, forgive, and treat people. Quit digging yesterday's junk out of the hamper. Lord, help me remove anything from my life that doesn't resemble Jesus. May people see and hear Him through me each and every day I live. In His name, amen.

Friday: Read Colossians 3:10. Following Jesus isn't only about what we stop doing. Paul says we have “put on the new self.” Jesus is making us new, so growth should be happening. Maybe slowly. Maybe imperfectly. But something should be changing. Love differently. Speak differently. Forgive differently. Serve differently. Attend in person regularly. Keep growing. Keep changing. Keep your eyes on glory. Jesus, continue making me new. Shape my heart, thoughts, words, and actions until people see more of You through me. In You, amen.

Saturday: Finish up tomorrow's section by reading verse 11 today. Paul tears down the walls we build between people and reminds us that “Christ is all and in all.” At the foot of the cross, nobody gets VIP seating. We're sinners saved by the same Savior, covered by the same grace, and headed toward the same glory. Tomorrow, don't just attend church...look around and see family. Lord, tear down the walls I build and help me see and love people through the eyes of Jesus. Christ is all. Help me show You to everyone. In Jesus' name, amen.
