KCC Daily Devotion

Monday: We spend a lot of time asking, “What should I do?” Paul gives us a pretty good starting place: “Let the peace of Christ...rule your hearts” (Colossians 3:15). The word “rule” carries the idea of an umpire making the call. Imagine letting Jesus’ peace make the call instead of anger, fear, pride, or worry. What’s calling the shots in your heart? Check out Colossians 3:15 and consider it. Jesus, rule my heart on the daily. Let Your peace guide my reactions, choices, and words every single day. In Jesus’ name, amen.

Tuesday: Paul finishes Colossians 3:15 with three simple words: “And be thankful.” Well...that sounds easy until somebody gets on your last nerve by breakfast! Gratitude ain’t pretending everything’s perfect, it’s recognizing God is good even when everything ISN’T perfect. Thankfulness changes how we see what’s happening around us because we begin noticing blessings instead of only burdens. Spend some time with Colossians 3:15 today. Father, open my eyes to Your goodness. Help gratitude become part of how I live, not just something I occasionally say. Help me live out what I claim. In Jesus, amen.

Wednesday: What lives in your house eventually influences your house. Paul says in Colossians 3:16, “Let the word of Christ dwell richly among you.” Not visit occasionally. Not stop by on Sunday morning. DWELL. Live there. Take up residence. God’s Word should become so much a part of us that it shapes our conversations, decisions, relationships, attitudes, and priorities. What’s been dwelling in you lately? Lord, fill my heart and mind with Your Word until Your truth becomes visible in the way I live and love others. Through Jesus, amen.

Thursday: Following Jesus was never meant to be a solo adventure. Read Colossians 3:16 and notice the words “teaching and admonishing one another.” We need each other! Sometimes I need encouragement. Sometimes I need correction. Sometimes I need somebody who loves me enough to lovingly say, “Cameron...that ain’t right.” That’s family. Mature Christians don’t simply attend church together; we help one another become more like Jesus. Father, give me humility to receive help and enough love to offer it graciously when needed. Help me value being together and growing together. In Jesus name, amen.

Friday: There ought to be a song somewhere inside a follower of Jesus. Colossians 3:16 speaks about singing “psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs, with gratitude in your hearts to God.” Notice Paul connects worship with gratitude again. Worship ain’t merely what happens when the music starts Sunday morning. Worship grows from a heart that recognizes who God is and what He has done. Today, find a reason to sing...even if you can’t carry a tune in a bucket with a lid on it! Father, put gratitude in my heart and praise on my lips today. You are worthy. Help me worship on the daily. Through Jesus, amen.

Saturday: Want a simple rule for how to live? Here you go: “Whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus” (Colossians 3:17). Whatever. Wherever. Whenever. EVERYTHING. Before doing something, ask yourself, “Can/should I honestly put Jesus’ name on this?” That question could change quite a bit about how we live. Jesus, let my words and actions represent You well every.single.day. May everything I do point somebody toward Your goodness, grace, and love. Guide me, Jesus. In Your name, amen.
