KCC Daily Devotion

Monday: God has always been about setting people apart for His work. In Acts 13:2-3, the church fasted, prayed, and laid hands on Barnabas and Saul, sending them out. This wasn't about titles... it was about calling. God still calls ordinary people to holy work. Ministry isn't just for "them"... it's for us. He sets aside those willing to say yes. Maybe the question today isn't "who is called?"... but "am I available?" Lord, help me be willing and ready for whatever You set before me. Help me serve however needed. In Jesus, amen.

Tuesday: Elders are shepherds under the Chief Shepherd. 1 Peter 5:2-3 reminds them to shepherd God's flock willingly, eagerly, and by example. That's not easy work... it's weighty. They carry spiritual responsibility for the church family. Today, let's lift up our six elders... not critique them, not second guess them... but pray for them. Strong churches are built on prayed-for leadership. God, strengthen and guide our elders. Give them wisdom, courage, and unity as they lead us. Keep their focus on serving this family. In Jesus' name, amen.

Wednesday: Deacons aren't about status... they're about service. In Acts 6:3, they were chosen to meet needs so ministry could flourish. They step into the gaps... often unseen, often unthanked. That's kingdom greatness. Today, don't just appreciate them... support them. Serve alongside them. Make their work lighter by stepping in where you can. Lord, bless our deacons with strength and joy. Help them to serve faithfully and not sit on the sidelines. As they follow the guidance of our elders, use them as they serve KCC. In Jesus name, amen.

Thursday: Scripture calls us to pray for those who teach and lead. Hebrews 13:17 says they keep watch over souls. That's heavy. So today... lift up Cameron and Hollie. Pray for strength in private, faithfulness in public, and joy in the journey. Ministry can pour you out... so let's be a church that pours back into them. Pray for them as they have faithfully served our family here at KCC for almost 24 years now. Pray for their family as their children begin their own families. Pray for God to use them and lead them as they minister to us. God, protect and encourage Cameron and Hollie. Fill their home with peace, strength, and joy. Help us pour into them as they pour into us. In Jesus, amen.

Friday: We aren't just individuals... we're family. 1 Corinthians 12:26 says if one suffers, all suffer... if one is honored, all rejoice. That's real connection. Pray for each other today. Try not to just throw up vague prayers... give intentional ones. Names, faces, needs. Check in. Encourage. Carry burdens. This is how the church actually looks like Jesus. Lord, help us love each other deeply and genuinely. Teach us to care, show up, and lift one another up. In Jesus, amen.

Saturday: Tomorrow isn't just a service... it's a moment. In Ephesians 4:12, we're reminded we're being equipped for the work of ministry. So today, prepare your heart. Pray for unity. Pray for growth. Pray that God moves in a real way as we take time to pray over one another. Come expecting something more than routine. Father, prepare our hearts for tomorrow. Move among us, grow us, and use us for Your glory. Through the perfect name of Jesus, amen.
