Sermon: "Lord of All!!!"

KCC Daily Devotion

Monday: In Mark 11:27-33, they asked Jesus the question we all ask, even if we don't say it out loud: "Who gave You the right?" And Jesus didn't panic. He didn't stutter. He didn't backpedal. Authority doesn't need to prove itself... it just is. The real issue wasn't Jesus' credentials—it was their hearts. They didn't want truth. They wanted control. But Jesus doesn't fit inside our systems. He is not up for a vote. He's Lord. Good God Almighty, forgive me for wanting control. Teach me to surrender to Your authority. In Jesus perfect name, amen.

Tuesday: Jesus tells a parable in Mark 12:1-12 about a vineyard. The tenants act like the vineyard belongs to them. They abuse the servants, and then the owner sends his son, and they kill him. That's not just a story about Israel's leaders. That's a mirror for every heart that wants God's blessings but not God's rule. We love the vineyard...life, family, strength, money, health... but sometimes we resist the Owner. Jesus is the Son. And when the Son shows up, authority isn't a debate... it's a decision. Lord, I don't want Your gifts without Your Lordship. Rule my heart each and every day. In Jesus name, amen.

Wednesday: In Mark 12:13-17 we read how they tried to trap Jesus with politics. "Should we pay taxes or not?" And Jesus hit them with that legendary line: "Give to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." In other words: yes, respect earthly authority... but never confuse it with *ultimate* authority. Governments may carry influence, but only Jesus carries worship. The coin had Caesar's image, but what about you? Do you carry God's image? Your all belongs to Him. Father, help me respect earthly leaders without ever replacing Your throne. I belong to You. In Jesus, amen.

Thursday: The Sadducees (Mark 12:18-23). They didn't even believe in resurrection, but asked a resurrection question trying to make Him look foolish. Ain't that still a thing today?! Some folks don't ask questions to learn... they ask questions to win. But Jesus isn't intimidated by critics. He's not threatened by mockery. His authority stands tall even when others roll their eyes. He doesn't just have answers...He **is** the Answer. Lord, keep me humble. Help me seek truth, not control. Strengthen my faith when others doubt. In Jesus, amen.

Friday: (Mark 12:24-27) Jesus looked at the Sadducees and said, "You are mistaken, because you don't know the Scriptures or the power of God." Whew. That's a holy gut-check. Many people reject Jesus' authority not because He's unclear... but because they don't know His Word and they've forgotten His power. Jesus doesn't just **teach** Scripture...He fulfills it. He doesn't just talk about power...He **is** power. He's the God of the living. Resurrection isn't a theory; It's His specialty. Lord, anchor me in Scripture and awaken me to Your power. Increase my trust in You. Help me reach the lost. In Jesus name, amen.

Saturday: In Mark 12:10-11, Jesus quoted Psalm 118: "The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone." They rejected Him... but God raised Him up. And that's still how it works. The world will dismiss Jesus as outdated, inconvenient, too strict, too narrow. But He remains the cornerstone. Not a decorative stone. The cornerstone. Everything in life lines up off of Him: marriage, parenting, leadership, integrity, purpose, eternity. He ain't just an option...He's the foundation. Jesus, be my cornerstone. Align my life with You. I trust Your authority over my heart and my future. In You I pray this, amen.
