Communion Meditation & Closing Prayer: Derrick Hall

Monday: Take time today to read Mark 14:12–42 and 1 Corinthians 10:11–13. We see Jesus preparing. He arranges the Passover meal. He teaches His disciples. He prays in the garden. Nothing about the cross catches Him off guard. Preparation always happens before the storm, not during it. Scripture was written as a warning and example for us. The question isn't **if** storms will come...but whether we're ready when they arrive. Faith that survives hard moments is faith that was prepared in quiet moments. Lord, help me prepare my heart today so I will stand firm tomorrow. In Jesus name, amen.

Tuesday: Before the disciples ever sat down at the table, Jesus had already prepared the place. A room. A meal. A moment of teaching. Everything was ready. Preparation often happens behind the scenes. In the same way, God works in our lives long before we realize it. The lessons we learn today... the scriptures we read... the prayers we pray... they're preparing us for moments we haven't yet faced. Spiritual readiness doesn't happen by accident. It happens through daily walking with Jesus. What you're doing today might be God preparing you for something tomorrow. Father, help me walk with You seriously. Use today to prepare me for whatever lies ahead. In Jesus, amen.

Wednesday: In Gethsemane, Jesus prayed. The disciples slept. Jesus was preparing His spirit for the suffering ahead. The disciples weren't. Preparation builds strength. Athletes train before the game. Soldiers train before the battle. Followers of Christ prepare before temptation comes. Paul reminds us in 1 Corinthians 10:13 that temptation will come, but God provides a way of escape. Often that "way" is the spiritual strength built through prayer, scripture, and faithfulness long before the moment arrives. A strong faith tomorrow starts with a faithful heart today. Lord, teach me to prepare through prayer and devotion so I will stand firm when temptation comes. In Jesus name, amen.

Thursday: Three times Jesus told the disciples in the garden, "Stay awake and pray." Preparation requires attention. Jesus knew what was coming. The disciples didn't...but He was trying to prepare them anyway. Sometimes God warns us ahead of time through His Word, wise counsel, or conviction in our hearts. The question is whether we're paying attention. A life of watching and praying keeps our hearts alert and ready. Storms don't give warnings very often... but Scripture does. God's Word prepares us for what life will bring. Father, keep my heart awake and attentive. Help me listen to Your Word and prepare my life accordingly. In the perfect name of Jesus, amen.

Friday: In the garden, the disciples struggled. Fear, confusion, and weakness surrounded them. Paul's words ring loudly here: "So whoever thinks he stands must be careful not to fall." (1 Corinthians 10:12) Preparation keeps us humble. Daily prayer, scripture, and walking with Jesus reminds us where our strength truly comes from. Our hope is in God who strengthens us. Lord, prepare my heart to stand firm in faith. Help me be prepared. In Jesus name, amen.

Saturday: Paul finishes with a powerful promise: God is faithful. He won't allow us to be tempted beyond what we can bear. He will provide a way out. When our hearts are grounded in scripture, prayer, and faith, we see the door God opens when temptation appears. Jesus prepared His disciples because He loved them. God prepares us for the same reason. He wants us to stand strong. God, prepare my heart for whatever lies ahead. Through Jesus, amen.
