**KCC Daily Devotion**

**Monday:** In Mark 7, Jesus heals a man who couldn't hear or speak. He didn't just help him a little—He restored him completely. That's how Jesus works. He doesn't halfway heal, halfway forgive, or halfway love. He does it fully and perfectly. When Jesus moves, He does it well. Sometimes we rush or settle for "good enough," but Jesus shows us excellence with compassion. Let's trust Him to finish what He starts, and may we serve others with that same heart of excellence. Lord, help me to serve, love, and live with excellence today—just like You, who does all things well. Thank You, Father. In Jesus' name, amen.

**Tuesday:** The crowd who witnessed the miracle in Mark 7:37 said, "*He has done everything well!*" That's not just a compliment—it's eternal truth. Jesus doesn't fail. He doesn't make mistakes. Even when we can't see His plan, His work is perfect. The same hands that opened deaf ears are still working in our lives with that same care and power. Rest today knowing His hand is steady and His purpose is good. Father, remind me that You do all things well. When I doubt or worry, help me trust in Your goodness and perfection. Help me follow You whole heartedly. I ask this through the mighty name of Jesus. Amen.

**Wednesday:** Jesus took the deaf man from Mark 7:33 aside, away from the crowd, before healing him. That's His way—personal, patient, and full of compassion. He doesn't rush your process or ignore your pain. He meets you right where you are. If you feel unseen today, know that Jesus sees you, knows you, and is working perfectly in your life, even in the quiet. Lord, thank You for meeting me personally. Help me trust Your timing and Your touch, knowing You always do all things well. Thank You. In the perfect name of Jesus, amen.

**Thursday:** In Mark 7:34, Jesus spoke just two words—"*Be opened.*"—and everything changed. Ears opened, tongues loosened, hope restored. That's the power of His Word! When Jesus speaks, darkness breaks, healing begins, and hearts awaken. Maybe you need Him to speak into your situation today. Invite His Word to move in power once again. Jesus, speak life into my heart today. Open what's closed, heal what's broken, and move in Your perfect way. Help me get out of my own way. I pray this in the powerful name of Jesus. Amen.

**Friday:** After the miracle of healing the deaf and mute man in Mark 7, Jesus told the people not to tell anyone—but they couldn't stay silent. His goodness overflowed! When God moves, His glory can't be hidden. We should be the same way—overflowing with gratitude and bold in sharing His works. Let your testimony declare His excellence. Lord, thank You for Your mercy and power. Help me to speak boldly of what You've done so others may see that You do all things oh-so-well. Thank You. I ask this through Jesus Christ my Lord, Amen.

**Saturday:** Jesus does all things well—and as His followers, we're called to do the same. Whatever you do, do it wholeheartedly for His glory. Whether serving, speaking, or loving, let excellence reflect the One who gave His best for you. The world should see Jesus in how we do what we do. Make sure You're a positive example by the way you love, speak, live for Him. Lord, help me to do all things well for Your glory. Let my actions reflect Your excellence and love. Oh how I long to shine for You. I pray this in the perfect name of Jesus. Amen.
