Sermon: "Preparing for the Future"

KCC Daily Devotion

Monday: (Mark 14:1-2) The religious leaders had already made up their minds. They weren't seeking truth...they were seeking a way to eliminate Jesus. Their hearts were hardened long before their plan was formed. Hate usually begins quietly like that. It grows when pride is threatened and control is lost. Instead of surrendering to Jesus, they tried to silence Him. That's the danger for us too. When Jesus challenges our comfort, will we resist Him or receive Him? Lord, keep my heart soft. When You confront me, help me respond with humility instead of resistance. I choose to love You more than my pride. In Jesus, amen.

Tuesday: (Mark 14:3) In the middle of all the growing hatred toward Jesus... Mark shows us something beautiful. Mary enters the room carrying expensive perfume and pours it out on Jesus' head. It was extravagant. It was costly. It was complete devotion. Real love for Jesus always looks a little extravagant to the world. People who don't understand devotion will call it wasteful. But love never measures the cost when the heart is full of gratitude. Jesus had changed her life, and she responded with love. Lord, help me love You freely and generously. I don't want to hold anything back from You. In Jesus, amen.

Wednesday: (Mark 14:4-5) Not everyone in the room understood Mary's act of love. Some immediately criticized her. "Why this waste?" they said. It's amazing how quickly love for Jesus can be misunderstood by people who are more focused on money, appearance, or control. True devotion will often draw criticism. When someone loves Jesus deeply, serves faithfully, gives generously...someone will always question it. But Jesus sees the heart behind the action. The opinions of the room never outweigh the approval of Christ. Father, help me love You boldly even when others don't understand. Your approval is what matters most to me. In the perfect name of Jesus, amen.

Thursday: (Mark 14:6-7) Jesus immediately stepped in to defend Mary. "Leave her alone," He said. What others called waste Jesus called beautiful. He saw the heart behind the gift. That's comforting because sometimes our acts of love for Jesus feel small or unnoticed. But nothing given in love is ever ignored by Him. A quiet prayer, a generous gift, a faithful act of service...Jesus sees it all. The world may misunderstand your devotion, but Christ never does. He receives every act of love as something precious. God, thank You for seeing what others miss. Accept my life as an offering to You. In Jesus name, amen.

Friday:(Mark 14:8-9) Jesus said Mary had anointed His body beforehand for burial. While others were blind to what was coming, the heart of love understood something deeper. Her act pointed toward the cross that was just ahead. Love sees Jesus clearly. It recognizes His sacrifice and responds with gratitude. Jesus even promised that wherever the gospel is preached, her act would be remembered. One quiet act of love became an eternal testimony. Loving Jesus always has lasting impact. Lord, help me live a life that honors Your sacrifice. May my love for You point to the cross. Through Jesus, amen.

Saturday: (Mark 14:10-11) From a moment of love to a moment of Judas' betrayal plans in motion. The contrast is stunning. Mary gave something precious...Judas sells Jesus for silver. One heart overflowed with love...another captured by greed. What is my heart truly devoted to? We daily make choices that reveal what we value most. Father, guard my heart from anything that competes with You. I choose devotion over compromise. In Jesus name, amen.
