The Flying Lizards hit song, "Money (That's What I Want)" was a big hit back in 1979. Wisdom about money is a much needed item. Society has forgotten how to live within their means. We have become bombarded with wanting more and more and never having enough. The average American household has \$8,674 in credit card debt alone, not counting mortgage, car payments, school loans, regular bills. Americans are \$1.14 Trillion in credit card debt. We need a lesson on financial wisdom! Lord, help us. Guide and focus our lives on what truly matters. In Jesus name, amen.

Tuesday: "The love of money is the root of all kinds of evil (1 Timothy 6:10)." This verse is often misquoted. Money is not the problem. We need money to pay bills, eat, have clothing, etc. This verse doesn't say money is the root of all evil. It isn't. The evil comes when we love money. Never having enough.

Allowing money to rule our lives and call the shots. Billy Graham said, "If a person gets his attitude toward money straight, it will help straighten out almost every other area of his life." Money can lead to great blessings or great curses. Pray we learn to follow God's plan and desire when it comes to money. God, help guide our thoughts and ways. Show us the right way. In Jesus, amen.

Help me to not overspend or purchase what's not needed. In Jesus name, amen.

Friday: Check out these Proverbs passages: 3:13-15; 22:1; **23:4-5**. Many a child's play, game, dance, party was missed because of trying to make a little extra money. Young folks often buy several new toys as soon as they get a job to then find themselves working to pay the items off and never being able to fully enjoy the purchase. Don't sacrifice what's truly of value for the sake of money. Father, help me gain the right focus. Lead and help me, Lord. In Jesus, amen.

Saturday: "Give me neither poverty nor riches, but give me only my daily bread. Otherwise, I may have too much and disown you and say, 'Who is the Lord?'" Or, I may become poor and steal, and so dishonor the name of God (Proverbs 30:8b-9)." Being content is a beautiful thing. It's truly a gift to be satisfied with what you have. Pray for this peace-filled contentment. Lord, as Paul told the Philippian Church in 4:12 how he "knew what it was like to have plenty and what it was like to be in need", help me be content with life. In Jesus name, amen.
