Communion Meditation & Closing Prayer: Jason Wilson

Monday: A rock tossed into water creates ripples far beyond the place it landed. The same is true with our lives. Every conversation, invitation, prayer, and act of kindness can ripple into eternity. Jesus built relationships with folks others ignored. We can't impact people we refuse to know. Missions minded living starts with caring enough to step toward people instead of away from them. Each one reaching one can change families, communities, eternity. Lord, help us create Gospel ripples today. Toss us where needed. In Jesus, amen.

Tuesday: Jesus said, "It is not those who are healthy who need a doctor, but those who are sick (Luke 5:31 CSB)". Jesus intentionally spent time with hurting people. He ate with sinners, spoke with outcasts, and loved those the church folk often overlooked. If we isolate ourselves from people who need hope, how can we share the hope of Jesus? The Gospel travels best through relationships. Sometimes the greatest sermon is simply sitting beside someone and showing them they matter. Lord, help us love people deeply and with intention. Use me to truly be the good this world needs. In Jesus name, amen.

Wednesday: Paul said he became "all things to all people" so that he might save some (1 Corinthians 9:22 CSB). Paul never changed the Gospel, but he tweaked his approach to reach different people. Missions minded living means meeting people where they are. Some folks need encouragement. Others need patience. Some simply need someone to listen. Relationships open doors that arguments often close. We're called to build bridges, not walls. One kind conversation today could become a ripple that leads someone closer to Jesus tomorrow. Father, use us to reach people lovingly through Jesus' name, amen.

Thursday: Ripples spread farther than we can see. You may never fully know how one invitation, one prayer, or one act of compassion impacts a person's life. Andrew brought Peter to Jesus, and Peter's ripple reached thousands. Never underestimate small acts of faithfulness. The devil wants us believing our efforts don't matter, but Heaven sees every seed planted. A missions minded church understands that reaching one person can eventually impact generations. Keep tossing Gospel rocks into the pond of life. Lord, help us stay faithful in outreach. Help us get started if we haven't yet. In Jesus, amen.

Friday: Relationships take time. Jesus walked with His disciples daily. He listened, taught, corrected, laughed, cried, and lived life beside them. Impact rarely happens through quick encounters alone. People need consistency and authenticity. They need to know we actually do care. Sometimes we get so busy doing church work that we forget to truly know people. Missions minded living slows down enough to build real connections. The strongest ripples often begin with simple moments of presence and compassion. Father, help us value people more than schedules. Help us truly be Your Church. In Jesus, amen.

Saturday: Imagine if every believer truly reached one person for Jesus, and those people reached one more. The ripple effect would be unstoppable. The early church changed the world not through popularity or wealth, but through transformed lives sharing hope relationally. You ain't gotta reach everybody... just love the people around you. Encourage, invite, pray with, share Jesus with somebody. A single ripple can travel farther than you think. Lord, make us a church that creates waves of Gospel impact. Woo! In Jesus name, amen.
