### **Communion Meditation & Closing Prayer: Jacob Wilson**

**Monday:** "I stand before the cross and wonder. I stand before the cross and fear."- Lois A. Cheney. Friday of "Holy Week" begins for us early in the morning, deep in the darkness. John 18:12 - 19:42; Mark 14:53 - 15:47; ; Luke 22:54 - 23:56; Matthew 26:57 - 27:61 record this day for us. Spend time today (and all week) reading these passages. Soak it all in. He did this for you! O, Lord, my God, how great Thou art! Help me, Father, to live in You only. Forgive my faults and failures. Heal my brokenness. Make me wholly Yours. In Jesus, amen.

**Tuesday:** "Then some began to spit on Him, to blindfold Him, and to beat Him, saying, 'Prophecy!' The temple servants also took him and slapped Him (Mark 14:65)." It's hard to read this part of the story of Jesus. It's hard for us to imagine folks who had most likely seen Him, heard Him, witnessed miracles done or at least heard the stories, now spit on, mock, slap, beat Jesus. Imagine if, when they would hit then ask "who hit you?!" He answered them. Imagine if He started telling their life story. Jesus showed such restraint. He knew all that lay ahead and He continued. Why?! For us! Father, forgive me when I don't feel like worshipping You. Forgive me when I put so many other things ahead of spending time reading Your Story or talking with You. Forgive me when I "spit" in Your face by not living the love You portray. I am sorry. In Jesus Name, amen.

**Wednesday:** As you read the passages from Monday and get to the part of the fulfillment of Jesus telling Peter of denying Him 3x, it can sting a little if you allow it to happen. From a servant girl asking, then a random person, to someone who was related to the man whose ear Peter had just cut off...folks keep trying to place Peter with Jesus and he keeps denying knowing Him. Then the cock-a-doodle-do slaps him hard (insert gasp). Peter looks up and immediately sees Jesus staring right at him. Luke 22:62 tells us that at that moment Peter ran away hard crying bitterly. I wonder what Peter saw in those eyes of Jesus. God, have mercy and pity on us all wrapped in some compassion as You look into our eyes. Strengthen us to always proclaim Your goodness. In Jesus Name, amen.

**Thursday:** From Annas to Caiaphas, the Sanhedrin to Pilate, then to Herod and by around 7:30am back to Pilate, Jesus is sent all over the place with the devil trying his best through folks to get Jesus terminated. It's sad how leaders, rulers, faithful "church folk" in this story all dress pretty and talk correctly, follow the rules and quote scripture even and sound so good...yet are not true followers and are simply puppets on the devils hand. How sad it is that we still allow him to pull our strings today. Lord, give us the strength to fight off the devils schemes. Build us up and focus our goal on reaching the lost. In Jesus, amen.

**Friday:** "They crucified Him". We see these 3 words quite a few times in the passages that were given Monday to read. By 9am on that Friday, the city was alive and bustling. Jesus is already nailed on a cross and still being mocked. Around noon...just 3 hours later...darkness falls over the land. Maybe this darkness was God removing His presence. 3 hours later, around 3pm, Jesus cried out "It is finished(John 19:30)", and, "Father, into Your hands I entrust my spirit(Luke 23:46)", and then bowed His head and gave up His spirit(John 19:30). No one took His life; He gave it. Father, thank You for this gift of life through Jesus. Help me live in a way to show gratitude. In Jesus Name, amen.

**Saturday:** Father, help me fill this day with quiet prayer. Help me prepare for worship as a family tomorrow. Build us up. Bind us together. In Jesus, amen.
