KCC Daily Devotion

Monday: “But be doers of the word and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves (James 1:22).” If you know what it says...then why ain't you doing it? Wow. Ouch. That's a questions that can slap you right in the face ain't it?! This coming Sunday we begin a new series studying the book of James together. This book of the Bible, although only 5 chapters...108 verses...is filled with a challenge for us to grow in our “Trek of Faith” by having a working faith. We desire to grow in our spiritual trek towards God. In order to grow, we must be doers of the words we study...not just hearers. O, Lord, help us grow. Help us live in You alone as we trek. In Jesus, amen.

Tuesday: The book of James, as mentioned yesterday, is only 5 chapters. This short book of the Bible is only 108 verses. We are going to take our time studying this one though as there is probably not more a practical book in all the Bible (other than Proverbs) than this letter of James. Over the next 4 months we desire to continue this trek of faith we just ended in studying the life of Abraham by working our faith. Spend time in prayer for this new study. Pray we apply the words heard and start living our faith out as we grow together. Lord, help me get out of my own way. Father, remove the blinders that I may see You calling. In Jesus name, amen.

Wednesday: In yesterdays devotion the preacher had the audacity to say that, aside from Proverbs, there is not a more practical book in the Bible. Really? Well, do people still have trials and temptations to deal with? Are we still dealing with prejudice and discriminations not only within society but even in the church? Do folks still claim faith with their mouth but their actions/lack of love/lifestyle/words don't show the faith they claim? Is there still a strong “worldliness” found among Gods people? This letter/book in the Bible touches all this and so much more. Pray we use this study to help reach One more. Father, grow me please. In Jesus, amen.

Thursday: James 1:1 begins by James informing us he is “a servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ”. He could have said he was the brother of Jesus. He could have given other adjectives, however, James simply desires readers to see him as a simple servant of God and Jesus. Theodore Roosevelt is credited with saying “People don't care how much you know until they know how much you care.” Oh, may this be said of our faith as we strive to work it out and reach the lost. God, help us. Help us grow in You and Your way and reach the lost. In Jesus name, amen.

Friday: James writes this letter to help spiritually lead those under his care. The elders of the church are not to be the C.E.O. nor the financial advisors. The leadership of a church family are not to be dictators or push what they want. James sets the fine example in how true leadership is shown in getting down and dirty with the hurt and needy. James shows how true leadership does what it takes to give the spiritual guidance and love while striving to feed the spiritually hungry around him. James shows what leadership is in reaching the lost and guiding all to Jesus however is needed. Oh that we too may come to the level of those without Jesus and reach One more. Lord, here we are. Use us to reach the lost. In Jesus, amen.

Saturday: 5 chapters. 108 verses. Over the next 4 months would you challenge yourself to read this entire letter from James each week? In around 30 minutes time you could read all 108 verses. You could read a chapter a day Monday thru Friday or all at once. Pray we all grow together. Pray our trek of faith greatly improves as we work our faith and put to practice these truths. Lord, help us. In Jesus, amen.
