Communion Meditation & Closing Prayer: Jamie Nash

Monday: (Mark 11:1-10) Jesus didn't ride into Jerusalem by accident. He fulfilled prophecy and made a statement. A donkey isn't a war horse...it's a picture of a King who brings peace, not panic. The crowd shouted "Hosanna!" but many of them only wanted Jesus to fix their problems, not rule their hearts. That's the challenge for us too. He is Lord of **all**...but is He Lord of **me**? Not just Savior when I'm in trouble...Lord when I'm comfortable. Jesus, rule my heart today. I don't just want Your help, I want Your Lordship. In You, amen.

Tuesday: (Mark 11:1-7) The owners of the colt didn't argue nor negotiate. They simply let Jesus have what He asked for. That's a sneaky powerful detail. Sometimes the clearest sign Jesus is Lord isn't a big sermon...it's a simple yes. "You can have it." Our time, plans, attitude, wallet, schedule. Lordship shows up in what we release. Jesus isn't just asking for Sunday...He's asking for ownership. The question isn't "Do I believe?"...It's "Do I surrender?" Lord, help me release what I'm holding too tightly. You can have it. Through Jesus, amen.

Wednesday: (Mark 11:11) Mark says Jesus entered the temple and "looked around at everything." Then He left. That's sobering. Jesus sees what we overlook. He notices what we tolerate. He inspects what we excuse. And He does it as Lord, not as a guest. We can get good at looking spiritual on the outside while our hearts are cluttered inside. But Jesus walks into the "temple" of our life and looks around. Not to **shame** us...but to **claim** us. He loves us too much to leave us unchanged. Good God Almighty, search me today. Show me what needs to change...and give me courage to obey. In Jesus, amen.

Thursday: (Mark 11:12-14, 20-21) Jesus cursed the fig tree because it looked alive but had no fruit. That's the point. It had leaves, but no results. That hits close to home. It's possible to look like, talk like, even attend like a believer...and still not bear fruit. Jesus isn't impressed by leaves. He's looking for love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, and self-control.

Lordship isn't just what we say...it's what grows from our life. Lord, don't let me be all leaves and no fruit. Grow something real in me. In Jesus name, amen.

Friday: (Mark 11:15-18) Jesus flipped tables because worship had become business. The temple was meant to be a place of prayer, but it had become a place of noise, greed, and convenience. When Jesus is Lord, He will clean what's contaminated. He'll confront what's corrupt. He'll remove what doesn't belong. And yes...it can feel uncomfortable. But it ain't cruelty...It's love. The Lord doesn't destroy His temple...He restores it. He isn't trying to embarrass you...He's trying to free you. Father, flip whatever needs flipping in me. Make my life a house of prayer again. Build me back better. Through Jesus, amen.

Saturday: (Mark 11:22-25) Jesus connects Lordship to faith, prayer, and forgiveness. If He's Lord, then prayer isn't a last resort...it's our first move. Faith isn't wishful thinking...it's trusting the One who reigns. And forgiveness isn't optional...it's obedience. Jesus says unforgiveness clogs up our prayers. That's heavy. But it's also hopeful, because it means freedom is possible. The Lord of all wants to rule our hearts, not just our circumstances. And when He rules...peace follows. Lord, increase my faith. Teach me to pray. Help me forgive like You forgave me. You are Lord of all I am. In the perfect name of Jesus, amen.
