Communion Meditation & Closing Prayer: Cameron Bailey

Monday: (Mark 12:28-31) Jesus doesn't stutter when asked what matters most. He doesn't list ten things. He doesn't start a debate. He says the greatest command is to love God... and the second is like it: love your neighbor. That means Christianity isn't mainly about winning arguments or looking spiritual. It's about love. Real love. Love that shows up in your decisions, your words, your attitude, and your patience. If we get **love** right, we get **life** right. Jesus, help me love You and love Your people each and every day. In Your name, amen.

Tuesday: (Mark 12:30) Jesus says love God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. That's not "church love." That's not "Sunday love." That's an "all-in" love. It means God doesn't want a corner of your life... He wants the whole thing. Your thoughts. Your emotions. Your energy. Your plans. Your reactions. And let's be honest... we love God in pieces sometimes. But Jesus calls us to wholehearted devotion. Not perfection... but surrender. Lord, take every part of me. Help me love You fully. Please forgive me when I don't. In Jesus, amen.

Wednesday: (Mark 12:31) Loving your neighbor isn't a vibe... it's action. It's what you do when someone is annoying. It's how you respond when you're tired. It's how you treat the person who can't help you. Jesus doesn't say, "Love your neighbor if they deserve it." He says love them like you love yourself. That means their pain matters. Their needs matter. Their story matters. If God's love has touched us, it should spill out of us. Father, make me a person who loves like You love. Help me love others. Help me love me. In Jesus, amen.

Thursday: (Mark 12:32-34) The scribe agrees with Jesus and says loving God and others is more important than sacrifices. Jesus tells him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." That's huge. Because it shows you can be religious and still miss the point. God never wanted empty routines. He wanted hearts. Loving God and loving people isn't a side dish to faith... it **IS** faith. The closer you get to Jesus, the more your faith becomes simple: love God deeply and love people honestly. Good God Almighty, keep my faith real and my heart close to Yours. Help me stop playing. Help me go "all in". In Jesus name, amen.

Friday: (Mark 12:38-40) Jesus warns about religious leaders who love attention. They want respect, seats of honor, and public praise. They look spiritual... but their hearts are selfish. That hits hard. Because it's possible to do "God things" for people to notice us instead of to honor Him. Love doesn't need a spotlight. Love serves quietly. Love gives without applause. Love is faithful when nobody sees. Jesus calls us to a humble faith that cares more about pleasing God than impressing people. Lord, protect me from pride. Help me serve with pure motives. Please guide KCC to be the Church You desire. In Jesus name, amen.

Saturday: (Mark 12:41-44) The widow didn't give much by the world's standards...but Jesus said she gave more than everyone else. Why? Because she gave all she had. That's what loving God looks like. It isn't measured by how much we have left after giving. It's measured by trust. The widow's gift was worship. It was surrender. It was love. And it reminds us: God isn't impressed by the size of the offering...He's moved by the size of the heart behind it. Father, teach me to trust You completely and love You with all I am. I know I need to give You my firsts and my best. Help me be real. In Jesus name, amen.
